Dear Parents and Carers

As we come to the end of the first half term, I'd like to take a moment to thank you for your ongoing support. It has been a positive and productive start to the academic year, and your continued partnership is instrumental in helping us uphold high standards and create a respectful, focused learning environment for all our students.

Ahead of our return to school after the half term break, I'm writing to remind you of our school uniform and behaviour expectations. Consistency in these areas helps reinforce our school values and supports a sense of pride and belonging among our students.

Each day, students must wear the following:

- School blazer
- School tie
- White shirt
- Tailored black trousers
- Black socks
- Plain black shoes (no embellishments or visible logos)
- School lanyard with timetable attached

and carry a suitable bag.

PE kit must be brought to school on days when PE is timetabled or for enrichment.

Students may wear a small amount of jewellery:

- A watch
- 1 ring
- 1 one pair of stud earrings (smaller than a 5p coin)
- A clear plastic retainer may be worn in a nose piercing

Please note that the following items are not permitted:

- Skirts or shorts
- False eyelashes
- Excessive makeup in Years 10 and 11 or any make up in Years 7, 8 and 9
- Bracelets
- Nose studs other than a plastic retainer
- Any other facial piercings



If a student wears jewellery that does not meet our policy, it will be confiscated and may be held until the end of the school week, to be collected after school on Friday. We kindly ask for your support in reminding your child of this rule to avoid any disruption.

Trainers are not permitted as part of the regular school uniform. If your child requires trainers for medical reasons, please ensure that medical evidence is provided to the school office in advance. Approved trainers must be plain black, with no visible logos, coloured soles or decorative elements.

To maintain fairness and consistency, students who do not meet the uniform expectations may be removed from circulation and placed in the Reflection Room until the issue is resolved. We would much prefer to avoid this and appreciate your support in ensuring your child returns to school fully prepared and correctly dressed.

All mobile phones must be either secured in Yondr pouches at the start of the school day or handed in at the school gate upon arrival. Mobile phones must not be seen or used during the school day. Any student found with a phone outside of these procedures will have it confiscated, and an appropriate consequence will be issued in line with our behaviour policy. Your cooperation in reinforcing this message at home is greatly appreciated, as it helps us maintain a focused and distraction-free learning environment.
